
This commonality of faith serves as a bridge upon which individuals and communities can find mutual respect, understanding and ultimately, peace.



A Bridge To Peace

The IEA was founded during the height of the 2nd Intifada. It's operational concept is simple and effective, to bring together people of faith estranged by sectarian divides and engage them in direct interpersonal encounters. Under the faciliatory support of the IEA, this model of encounter has become a leading means of interfaith & intergroup dialogue in the region.

The IEA's methods have become the subject of research from academic institutes including Harvard, Bar Ilan and DePaul Universities. Multi-year studies from these institutes have affirmed with veracity the efficacy of the IEA's encounter model for transformative positive change.



Advancing Despite Adversity

Over its 23 years of operation, the IEA has persevered and thrived amidst every challenge the region has faced, growing each year despite & in light of adversities.

Since October 2023, the IEA has redoubled its efforts to galvanise public awareness and engagement in encounter activities. Through a series of social media campaigns and by word-of-mouth, 2024 has become a **record year** for new public engagement, registrations and group formations - exemplifying the thirst amongst people of the region for coming to understand and encounter 'the other'.

This year the IEA has received >300 new participant registrations, leading to a capacity overhaul of many existing encounter groups and the founding of 6 new.

Encounter Group Types

When forming a new encounter group, the IEA team works with local communities to determine the need and desire for encounter opportunities and enables for a plurality of group types that best serve each context. The range of encounter groups formed include:

- 10 Youth Groups
- 14 Women's Groups
 - 6 Religious Leaders Groups
- 16 Professions Groups
- 27 Student Groups
 - 3 Topical Learning Groups

Growing Support

The IEA has been recognised by multiple organizations including: **UNESCO** recognition status, **Women's Peace Initiative Award** (Tanenbaum Center for Interreligious Understanding,) Immortal Chaplains Foundation's Prize for Humanity, IIE Victor J. Goldberg Prize for Peace in the Middle East, 2022 Israel's Presidential Award for Volunteerism.

Building on the established momentum of engagement across the region to catalyse an exponential growth in new encounters.
